### **President's Message**

#### **Transitions**

When I was young, I would look at adults and assume that's who and what they are and nothing changes. I thought adults went to work in the morning, came home, went to bed, and woke up to do the same thing the next day. The older I get the more I have come to terms that life is never static. Life is busy, fluid, and forever-changing. There is always the end of something on the horizon, but by the time that comes something else comes in to take its place.

The same can be said about nature and birding. Winter gives way to spring which transitions to summer, then transcends into fall and we repeat the cycle again. Looking through a finer lens, though, there are changes almost constantly. Spring starts with blackbirds, followed by ducks, then all hell breaks loose when the warblers move through. The "breeding season" is the heat of the year where some birders put their binoculars down until "fall migration." But spring migration typically doesn't end until after the second week of June, and there are only about two weeks where bird song peaks until swifts, swallows, starlings, robins and blackbirds begin once again to utilize roosts. There's post-breeding dispersal of orioles and night-herons, shorebird migration after that, passerines following in waves, and as it gets colder we look for semi-hardies on Christmas Bird Counts and then first-of-years in January.

And then there's February....

But sometimes by slowing down we get the most satisfaction and make our own little discoveries: watching a Song Sparrow continuously grab bugs and hop into a bush, a robin grab way more worms in its bill than should be physically possible, noticing crows or blackbirds all heading in the same direction at dusk and trying to track down a roost. There are infinite "ornithological discoveries" to be made near and far, whether on a large scale involving migration or on a small scale like finding nests in the back yard. There are even some unexpected finds, like an Eastern Kingbird, a Tropical Kingbird, and a Scissor-tailed Flycatcher all in the same tree! Life travels by fast, but one of the best aspects of nature is to be able to slow down, soak it in, and enjoy.

They often occur seasonally in large numbers in weed fields. garden plots, salt marshes, in thickets along woodland edges, and at winter bird feeders. Their conservative plumage and furtive habits make them both challenging to locate and to identify. Fortunately some of their songs are among the richest in the bird world. The emphasis of this program will be on providing participants with a general understanding of the habitats that sparrows prefer, the status of different sparrows in Massachusetts, and how to distinguish different species when they are encountered in the field. Winter seabirds include a rich assortment of waterbird species ranging from sea ducks, loons, and gulls, to fulmars, gannets, and alcids. Chilling winds, stormy seas, and blinding precipitation can sometimes make seabird identification challenging, and glare and lighting

conditions can often distort viewing clarity. Despite these characteristics winter sea birding can be exciting and often rewarding, and the hardships of finding and viewing winter seabirds are often offset by the opportunity of seeing a variety of boreal species seldom found at any other time of the year. This workshop will focus on the characteristics of different groups of seabirds – their

adaptations, breeding and feeding behaviors, the identification and status of species occurring in

Massachusetts, and some of the conservation issues associated with seabirds. The Death March on January 11 will focus on finding and viewing a variety of seabird species described in the lecture.
